

1. What did Jesus say the Holy Spirit would give his disciples the power to do?
How did they do that in this Bible story?

Multi-Sensory Idea: Get creative and think of a way that you can tell others about Jesus today. Write a play about Jesus and perform it; or write letters to others to tell them about Jesus; or make signs to hang around the church to let others know that Jesus loves them. There are many ways to tell others about Jesus.

Prompts for Deeper Discussion: Why do you think it was important for the disciples to have the Holy Spirit with them? Do you think it is still important for us to have the Holy Spirit with us today? Why or why not?

2. After the disciples told others about Jesus they invited them to accept Jesus as their Savior. What else did they tell them to do?

Multi-Sensory Idea: Use clay to sculpt a person and some water. Show how the people were baptized during the days of Jesus and discuss how that is similar and/or different from the way that people in your church are baptized.

Prompts for Deeper Discussion: Do you think baptism is an important step in someone's faith? Do you think baptism is important to Jesus? Why or why not?

3. What gift did Peter tell people that they would receive when they accepted Jesus as their Savior? What is special about this gift?

Multi-Sensory Idea: Fire, or a flame, is one of the symbols of the Holy Spirit because of the way it came to the disciples on the day of Pentecost. Color this symbol of the Holy Spirit with the attached coloring sheet. Talk about how the Holy Spirit helped the disciples that day.

Prompt for Deeper Discussion: If you have accepted Jesus as your Savior, you have the power of the Holy Spirit to help you. What are some ways that you, or someone you know, has been helped by the Holy Spirit? *(Teachers, you may need to share a personal experience to get the conversation started.)*

Prayer Prompt: Tell students that God loves us very much and it makes Him happy when we come to Him in prayer. Ask them to join you in prayer right now.

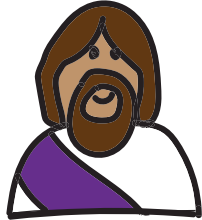
*Heavenly Father,

Instructions: Lead the student into prayer. Invite them to point to who they would like to pray for.

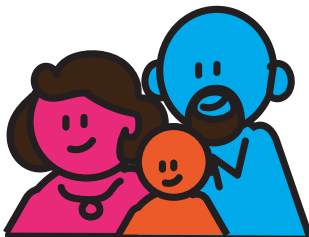
